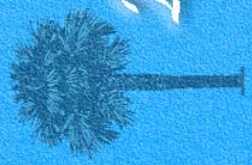

District 58 finished the 2005-2006 Toastmasters year as the NUMBER 1 district in the United States and NUMBER 5 in the WORLD. Our top finish makes us a President's Distinguished District for the first time since 1996 and

marks a dramatic improvement from our standing last year as 68th in the world.

Dilip Abayasekara, President of Toastmasters International, will present a special award to Cat Angus, DTM, PDG during the Hall of Fame ceremony at the 75th Annual Toastmasters International Conference in Washington, D.C. on August 23—26. ## Speech Contests—Why Should You Compete?

Why does District 58 sponsor and encourage speech contests? The purpose of a speech contest is to provide an opportunity for speakers to improve their speaking abilities, to recognize individual Toastmasters as an encouragement to all, and to provide an opportunity for all Toastmasters to learn by observing speakers who have benefited from their Toastmasters training. Each contest (International, Humorous, Evaluation, and Table Topics) focuses on a particular set of skills, providing a terrific opportunity to hone your skills in a specific area of communication.

By participating in Toastmasters contests, we're able to enjoy a unique experience of self-improvement; an experience that is only available to those who compete. You can't buy this experience in a store. You can't benefit by reading about it in a book or listening to a tape. You can't even get it from attending your own Toastmasters club every week. You can only receive this special gift by participating in Toast-

masters contests at or beyond the club level.

### Seven Reasons to Compete:

1. Introduce members to the idea that there is more to Toastmasters than just the club level, including division and district events.
2. Compel members to step beyond their comfort zone.
3. Offer a forum to speak outside the club.
4. Provide members the opportunity to test their skills against Toastmasters from other clubs.
5. Challenge members to prepare in advance and do the best job they can.
6. Inject large doses of pride and confidence into each contestant.
7. Create community awareness of the opportunities in the **Toastmasters** program.

Perhaps a better question than "Why compete?" may be "**Why not compete?**" Because competitions can require lots of practice, they promote self improvement. And for each higher level of competition, there is generally a higher level of proficiency, larger audiences, and an opportunity for yet another learning experience.

Join in the fun by participating at your local level and then by cheering on the winners as they climb the speakers ladder to the top rung of success. Or perhaps you'll be the one being cheered on.

Talk to your club president today and put your name in the hat. Let's hear your funniest stories or your best evaluation!

## 2005 –2006 A Fantastic Year!

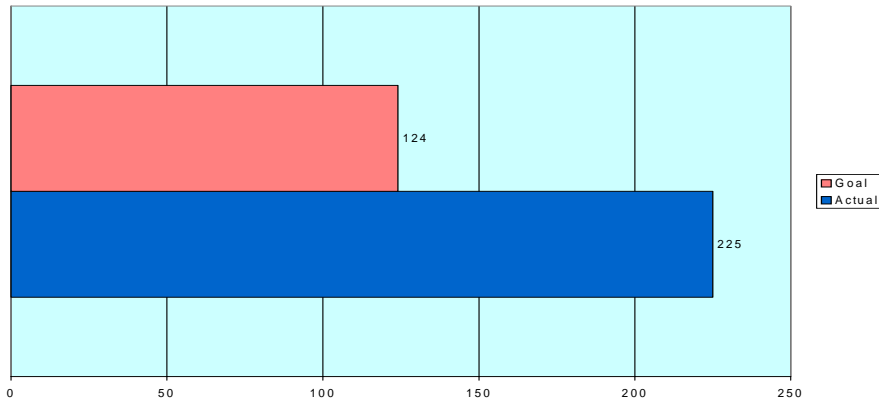
Like all professional organizations, Toastmasters International (TI) has measurements and goals to ensure the continued success of its members. Each year TI sets a bar of performance for each District. We can then measure our success by how close to the mark we landed.

Here are the numbers for the year ending June 30th. District 58 started the year with 101 clubs. Toastmasters International set the goal to end the year with 104 clubs. District 58 went over and above finishing with 111 clubs. Our member numbers also grew exponentially, finishing the year 103% above our goal with 3,852 members.

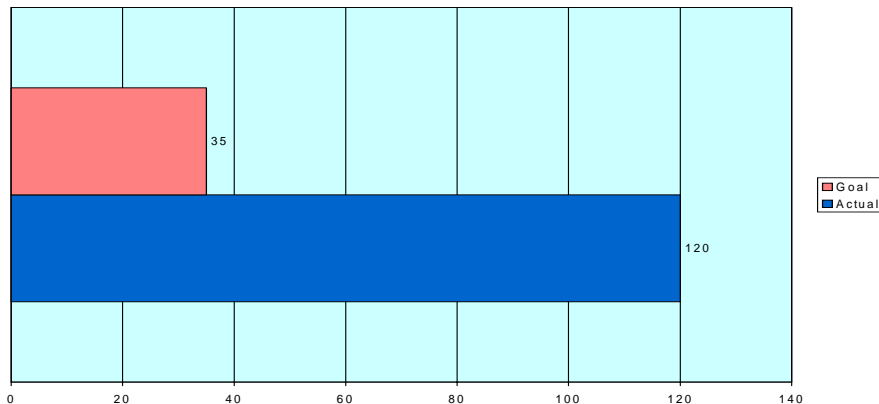
We also surpassed TI's educational goals for us. We were projected to earn 124 CTM's (Competent Toastmaster awards) and 35 ATM's (Advanced Toastmaster awards) last year. As you can see from the charts, we blew by these goals finishing the year with 225 CTM's and 120 ATM's.

We can never rest on our laurels though. The 2006-2007 year is ahead. Start planning now so that your club will surpass last year's performance . Can you add two more members than you did last year? How about one more CL or CC (Competent Communicator)? We are poised to take the District to its highest pinnacle ever, but it will take team work and YOU.

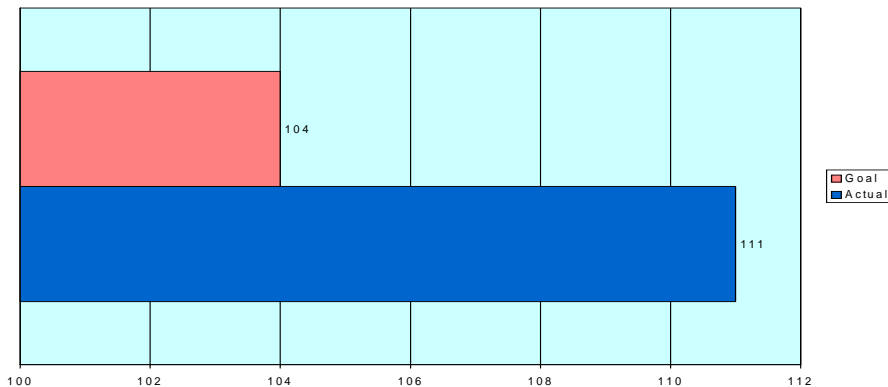
2005-6 CTMs - 181% Over Goal



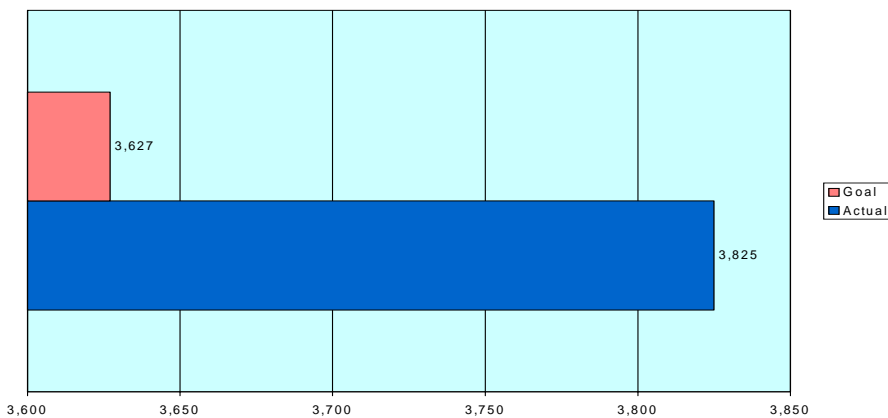
2005-6 ATMs - 343% Over Goal

# DISTINGUISHED CLUB PROGRAM—FRESH START

## How It Works

The Distinguished Club Program (DCP) is an annual program, running from July 1 through June 30. The program consists of 10 goals your club should strive to achieve during this time using the Club Success Plan as a guide. World Headquarters tracks the progress of your club toward these goals throughout the year, sending quarterly progress reports to your club president. At year-end, World Headquarters calculates the number of goals the club achieved and recognizes it as a Distinguished Club, Select Distinguished Club, or President's Distinguished Club based on the number of goals achieved and the number of members it has.

### Goals to Achieve

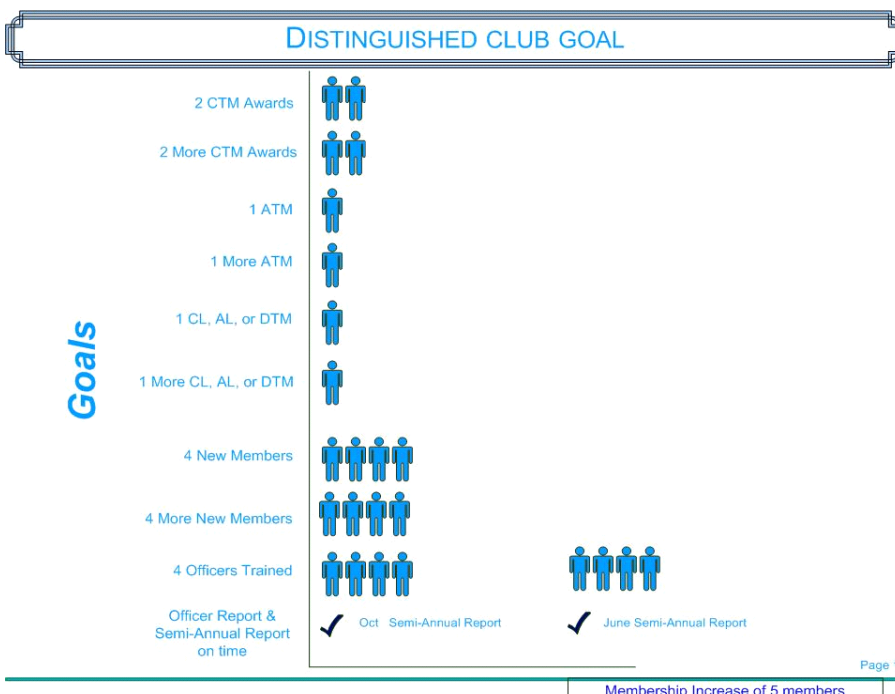
Following are the goals your club should strive to achieve during the year:

1. Two CTMs
2. Two more CTMs
3. One ATM-B, ATM-S, or ATM-G
4. One more ATM-B, ATM-S, or ATM-G
5. One CL, AL, or DTM
6. One more CL, AL, or DTM
7. Four new members
8. Four more new members
9. Minimum of four club officers trained during each of two training periods
10. One semiannual membership report and one club officer list submitted on time

In addition, your club must meet a membership requirement. At year-end (June 30) it must have:

- at least 20 members OR
- a net growth of at least five new members.

**REMEMBER**—District 58 is offering a prize for the first club to reach President's Distinguished with 10 of 10 goals! Don't fret if you're not first. There will be prize drawings for one Distinguished club, one Select Distinguished club, and one President's Distinguished club. The first 10 clubs to complete their DCP will also be recognized.

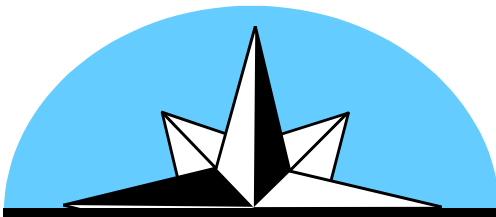
